East Hunsbury Remembers

In your last newsletter, we were looking for help, in order to create a community poppy display for the area. So many of the community stepped up, including many of you Seniors!

Hundreds of poppies were made, delivered to or posted to our office at the Library. The rest of the community rose to the challenge as well, with young families at home with children, all of our local schools, and so many individuals all making. Thanks especially to East Hunsbury W.I., to Ollie Lyons and Pauline Boler, for creating easy to follow patterns!

As Covid restricted how many people we could bring together at any one time, we brought small groups of volunteers together, to create our huge main poppy (build by our handyman Ady), and cascade panels. Our local schools ran workshops to create the field of plastic poppies, which also looked amazing, made from the bottoms of plastic bottles.

The display was installed outside Hunsbury Library for two weeks, with hundreds of people coming to visit, to take pictures, and to stand and pay their respects. We even made it in to the pages of the Chronicle and Echo, thanks to Rob Boler of the Seniors – our volunteer photographer. We also formed part of a drone-film of memorials in Northamptonshire, being highlighted amongst the traditional memorials in the older villages. It was so gratifying to see East Hunsbury represented.

In addition to our outdoor installation, we also created a memorial indoors at Hunsbury Library, which was greatly appreciated by the public. This again featured a community wreath, made with your poppies, and paper poppies from Wootton Park School. Also involved, were East Hunsbury Rocks Group, who created stones with the names of people, linked to our community, who gave their lives in war. A large rock was also created, to be a permenant feature of our East Hunsbury Remembers displays, for years to come.

Hunsbury Library Update:

The Library has reopened – albeit on short hours and with limited services. They are <u>open Tues and Thus 10am to 4pm, and Sat 10am – 12noon</u>. You can return books, order books, renew bus passes, use computers, and ask basic enquiries. All other services are temporarily suspended. This sadly includes Hermes Parcel Collection and Drop Off and Blue Badge applications. But the team will return to normal when possible.



Local Litter Issues – and our planned Litter Picks:

During Lock Down, we have had lots of the community contact us about litter issues, including the fly tipping taking place. The Parish Council have had some signs made, which have garnered a great reaction!



We have also had in-depth talks with the Air Ambulance Charity, as their bins at the Library and at The Collingtree Pub Car Park, have become such an issue. We are working with the landowners of the two sites to try to make the Air



Ambulance come to collect more regularly. We want to keep East Hunsbury Tidy.

We have also joined the <u>Great September Litter Pick</u>, with Keep Britain Tidy. If you want to join in a litter pick, <u>you must book on</u> so that we can plan for Covid regulations. Ring Liz or email her at the office – contact details at end of newsletter.
