BOOK REVIEW WITH BEN, EAST HUNSBURY LIBRARY

Hunsbury Library is open again for limitedtime browsing, and we have plenty of new releases on the shelves to get lost in this spring...

Beginning with a rare diamond of a book,



Benjamin Labatut delivers a rush of blood to the head in the exhilarating 'When We Cease to Understand the World'. Shortlisted for this year's International Booker Prize, Labatut pulls us back





through the history of science to unpack the mastery and madness of some of the field's greatest minds.

Booker Prize winning novelist Richard Flanagan returns with a dose of magical realism in The Living Sea of Waking Dreams, in which the harsh realities of climate change are placed against a dysfunctional family in denial of their mother's impending death. This strange, all-encompassing novel is wholly unique and showcases why Flanagan is worthy of such acclaim.

Ruth Hogan, author of The Keeper of Lost Things, returns with Madame Burova, a decades-spanning tale of tarot and truth-seeking. Burova has spent a lifetime listening to and unfurling the secrets of those who've entered her tent, and must fulfil one last promise before she retires. This scintillating story speaks of the years-long repercussions of decisions made by young generations.

For those in need of a heart-stopping mystery, Emma Stonex's The Lamplighters takes us down to the Cornish coast, as three lighthouse keepers vanish in a storm. Twenty years later, the women they left behind must reconcile with the past and in turn unearth the truth behind the disappearance. Liz loved this one – which is higher praise than any literary prize!

Lastly, for those who prefer their springtime spooky and gothic, then this atmospheric horror story might just do the trick. Catriona Ward's 'The Last House on Needless Street' teases with a cryptic premise, a tale "of a serial killer, a stolen child, revenge, death, and an ordinary house at the end of an ordinary street. All these things are true. And yet they are all lies..." We've heard some glowing opinions of this one, and it could be a contender for one of 2021's best books.

These and more are waiting for you at our library!

GARDENING HINTS FOR SPRING

Courtesy of Prima's monthly Womens' Magazine, please find 10 expert helpful



hints below to make the most of the spring time in your garden:

1. Set up a water butt to collect April showers in preparation for a long, hot summer ahead





(here's hoping).

- 2. Start mowing and edging the lawn regularly for a really good finish heighten the cut for the first few cuts.
- **3.** Remove weeds before they get too big and unruly.
- **4.** Keep up with potato planting and direct sowings of carrot, beetroot, spinach, chard, rocket and parsley.
- **5.** Indoors, sow pumpkins, courgettes, runner beans, french beans and sweetcorn into pots.
- **6.** Start to harden off young plants with protection for planting out keep a careful eye on the weather forecast.
- **7.** Save your seedlings by checking out nooks and crannies for slugs.
- **8.** If you have to use slug repellent, use Advanced Slug Killer as it doesn't harm the birds.
- **9.** For a small wildflower area with a bit of 'wow' factor, dig, weed and rake the area level, broadcast sow a packet of volcanic meadow mix and watch things bloom.
- **10.** Get the kids on board for a brilliant way to give them a break from their screens.

GREAT BRITISH SPRING CLEAN

Many of you are members of East Hunsbury Litter Pickers. This is a group of local people,

which now includes over 80 families, who regularly go out and pick litter in the local area.



In the last couple of months, East Hunsbury Parish Council have been funding equipment for these groups, including our local schools, and we are already seeing a great difference, with less litter on our streets and in our parks. We have also been delighted to receive support from TESCO, who have supplied equipment and who will be joining in with litter picks.

But – it is an ongoing challenge!

We have once again signed up to The Great British Spring Clean – over 3 weekends, there will be a focus on 3 different areas. Litter picker volunteers will be asked to join in. If you want to join in – let us know!
