David has very kindly provided as a separate attachment, important information to think about with the winter season on its way and helpful tips on how to keep safe with 'crime prevention'.

HOW YOU CAN SUPPORT THE POLICE IN CATCHING SUSPECTS:

To capture a criminal in these highly mobile times, it is of the utmost importance for the police to promptly obtain an accurate description.

Following are some of the most important identifiers that police need to apprehend suspects. Keep this information in mind so that you can give police an accurate description of any suspect or incident you may observe.

Person details:

This will include estimation of age, clothing descriptions such as colour and make along with height, build and colour of suspect, hair style and colour, facial hair and whether or not they have any distinguishing features such as visible tattoos. For example: "Bald White male in his midtwenties, approximately 6 feet in height, with a full beard and is slim in build. He is wearing a black adidas tracksuit with bright orange trainers and a tattoo on the right side of his neck."

Vehicle details: This will include make, model and colour of the vehicle as well as the registration number. Location and direction of travel would also give us a greater chance of locating suspects.

For example: "Black, Ford Escort, registration number KT18 DBZ travelling up the Wellingborough Road towards the town centre."

It is not always possible to get all of the description as listed above but use that as a guide for the sorts of things to pay attention to, when reporting suspect behaviour to the police.

We've got a cracking selection of titles for the festive season available to borrow at Hunsbury Library. Whether you want to get cosy with a



winter romance or get the chills from a nail-biting thriller, there's something for all to enjoy on our shelves.

Miranda Cowley Heller's The Paper Palace is

a masterful family saga that is tender and devastating. It unfolds over 24 hours yet explores a legacy of 50 years, this ambitious novel of multitudes pulls you in like quicksand and immerses you with its vivid prose.

Bryan Washington's *Memorial* is a beautiful and empathetic story of love and heartbreak. Benson and Mike, having spent several good years together, are thrust into a situation that will test the limits of their relationship. It's funny, it's moving – it's just a great read.

Emma Gannon's Olive is a love letter to friendship as a group of friends who've shared their lives together come to a crossroads. A light, warm book that will resonate with anyone finding their life turning in a new direction and experiencing the unease and excitement that comes with.

Catherine Lacey's Pew is a book that holds a mirror up to our world today. A mysterious silent man is found sleeping in a church in an American town. As the community tries to understand this quiet amnesiac, they find themselves undone by their own perceptions and prejudices.

Lastly, **Natasha Brown's** *Assembly* is a brisk, stunning work by an exciting new writer. Contemporary in every sense of the word, this stark and introspective story of a Black British woman coming to terms with her life and circumstances can be devoured in a single sitting.
